Toronto made things a lot more interesting in the battle for the AL East as they drew level with the Yankees following a very good 7-2 week. They opened with a hard fought series win over the D-Rays, progressed with a comfortable sweep in Chicago and ended with a home win over the A's to lay down the gauntlet to New York. Boston started with a good series win at home to the Yankees, consolidated with a road win in Milwaukee but fell at the final hurdle as they lost at home to the Rangers for only a solid 5-4 return for the week. Tampa won their 2nd series on the road in Anaheim but a sweep at home to the White Sox in their final series left them with a poor 3-6 record for the week. New York didn't recover from their slow start as they were swept in Seattle in their 2nd series and beaten at home in their 3rd by the Brewers for a very poor 2-7 week and the ominous shadow of the Blue Jays level in the race for the title.
