# **WEEK EIGHT REVIEW**

Buffalo's playoff pretensions were dealt a blow in New England where the Patriots proved to be far too good for them. The Bills defense played a tough game but got almost no help from the offense and crumbled in the fourth quarter. Miami continued their perfect start to the season with a sound thrashing of the Jets, after building a ten point first quarter lead they never looked like being threatened. Cincinnati made hard work of beating the Titans but the defense played well enough to preserve the first half lead. Baltimore looked in control for most of the game in Cleveland, racking up yardage but unfortunately not many points, when the Browns came to life in the fourth quarter they had no answers. Seattle came from behind with two fourth quarter touchdowns to overcome a Denver first half lead built on the back of turnovers. Oakland had an explosive first half before the offense went to sleep in the second half, the defense played well enough to limit the Chiefs' scoring opportunities.

Philadelphia got some great performances from defense and special teams that meant the offense didn't have to go very far to rack up over 50 points. The Giants passed the ball well but couldn't get anything going on the ground and paid dearly for each of their four turnovers. Dallas and Arizona entered the fourth quarter tied, the Cards could only manage a field goal, the Cowboys responded with the decisive touchdown. Green Bay looked fairly comfortable seeing off Chicago, though they may be slightly concerned that a very impressive offensive showing was only translated into 20 points. Detroit's one game

advantage at the top of the Central was lost to a fourth quarter field goal in Tampa. The 49ers seemed more like themselves this week, seeing off the Panthers with little difficulty. The Rams impressive season continued as they handed a thrashing to the visiting Saints.

Offensive performance of the week goes to St Louis, not quite as many points as the Eagles but they looked a lot more balanced getting them. Defensive performance of the week goes to Cincinnati for keeping a competent Tennessee offense out of the endzone. Special teams performance of the week goes to Philadelphia, a kick return touchdown, a punt return touchdown and four field goals making up for the slightly embarrassing missed extra point.

- Lions at Cowboys Two teams with the same record, but it looks like Detroit have got their by beating up on weak divisional opponents. COWBOYS BY 7
- 49ers at Cardinals San Francisco have yet to hit top form and may well struggle with the Arizona defense, but they are good enough to win on the road. 49ERS BY 7
- Rams at Giants Already looking like favourites for another NFC title, St Louis should despatch a New York team that is struggling to put points on the board. RAMS BY 14
- Saints at Packers Green Bay looked a lot better last week and should be able to find their way through New Orleans' obvious weaknesses. PACKERS BY 10
- Panthers at Bucs Tampa proved last week why they should be considered
