I said in my preview of this game that I thought the Bengals would come out rushing, and that I thought that the Raiders could have some success through the air. That was pretty accurate as the Bengals averaged 4.3 yards on 38 carries but unfortunately for them couldn't get the passing game going, completing just 48% of their throws for 181 yards. The Raiders passed for nearly 400 yards and 3 TDs but still had an impressive 70% completion rate. They were far from being one dimensional though, averaging exactly 5 yards per carry. Despite the difference in yardage there was only 5 points in it with a goalline interception for the Raiders being the difference in the end.

The second game resulted in a comprehensive win for the Rams. The Giants have had a very good year! due to their No.1 defence but they couldn't contain the Rams who passed for 222 yards and 4 TDs, they also rushed for 201 yards and a TD. The Giants were held to just over 200 yards in total and 8 first downs.
